


To make it clear why a map had been produced, surveyors included explanations. This detail from a pre-1875 Milford estate map clarifies that it was created to show which lands were owned by the Strutt Company, and which were owned personally by Anthony Radford Strutt.

This 1888 plan shows
Bridgehill House in Belper,
home of the Strutt family,
and was produced to show
the location of the gas,
water and drain pipes in
and around the building.
The house was demolished
in the 1930s and this
plan is the only surviving
document that shows
its layout. It only covers
the ground floor, as no
information about the other
floors was needed.



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
