- Be polite and helpful but avoid being over-friendly
- Don't have conversations that are, or may be interpreted to be, inappropriate or intrusive. Guard against a passenger becoming infatuated with you
- Don't exchange personal information through text messages or social media or take or swap photographs with passengers
- Never hug, kiss or touch a passenger in an inappropriate way
- · Never give food or gifts

 Don't ask personal information from a passenger, share your personal information or invite them to your home

Keep this with you as a handy reminder.

- · Stick to the agreed route
- Treat your passengers with dignity and respect
- Make sure you are aware of any special needs or illnesses
- Know how to use any special equipment such as restraints and how to secure wheelchairs, if applicable

- Be aware of how to spot signs of abuse or severe neglect. Abuse may be physical, psychological, financial or sexual
- If a passenger tells you, or if you suspect they are being abused, listen carefully, make a note if possible and report the information to Call Derbyshire 01629 533190.
